Laboratory Department; colorimeter in good condition but not in use due to lack of reagents





- Katenga Swamp (bordering Kayunga and Bukoloto)
- There was a lack of sensitization and monitoring and weak environmental protection.
- There was a lack of a District Environmental Plan.
