Central part of Uganda with its headquarters 148.4 Km from Kampala on road

3,661 Youths aged 18-30 years who were neither working nor in school by 2014

Youth Livelihood Programme (YLP)

Low recovery of YLP funds: from the financial year 2014/2015 to date, the district had recovered only Shs. 156,118,900(38.2%) out of the expected total amount due of Shs. 564,144,136 leaving an outstanding balance of Shs. 408,025,236

Women Enterprise Programme: from the financial year 2016/2017 to date, the district had recovered only Shs. 22,361,044 (50.8%) out of the expected total amount due of Shs. 43,995,169

Education (UBOS Census Report of 2014)

- Number of persons aged 6-15 years not attending school is 4,667
- Persons aged 15 years and above whose highest level of education is below S.4 was 56,223 (82.6 %)
- 22,501 of Persons aged 18 years and above who are illiterate

Lack of Basic Infrastructure in Primary Schools (from Auditor General 2018)

Targets: classroom pupil ratio of 1:55, desk pupil ratio of 1:3, latrine pupil ratio of 1:40 and housing for 4 teachers.

Magoma RC PS: Has only 2 classrooms, No staff accommodation and office

Kirinda P.S.: Has only 2 classrooms. No staff accommodation and office

Ngoma COU: Roof blown of classroom as shown below thus some classes share rooms.

Mpunge P.S.: The pupils sit on the floor due to lack of furniture

Kinyogoga Seed Secondary: A classroom block, Science block and a staff house funded under World Bank in **2013/2014** lacked windows and doors, the floor works and painting incomplete

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Health (UBOS Census Report of 2014)

- Only (27.4%) households were found to be 5 Km or more to the nearest health facility
- Only 8.5% households had access to piped water
- 1,461 households were without any toilet facility
- 41,429 (96.2%) households were not living in decent dwellings.

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Inspection of Semuto Health Centre IV (AG 2018)

Maternity Ward and Labour Suite: Labour suite was too small; no wheel chair to move mothers from labor suite to maternity ward; the ward had no separation for mothers who had caesarean operation

Theatre: No running water for over a year, blocked washrooms and drainage. The solar system for lighting and sterilising equipment had weakened and only worked for one hour. The theatre lamp lacked a bulb and thus not used.

Inadequate Funding of Nakaseke Hospital (2018)

- The hospital has been forced to stop vital services like the provision of meals to patients.
- The hospital is unable to perform basic maintenance of equipment and infrastructure.
- The Atomic Energy Council had closed the dental X-ray machine due to lack of an operating license (2019).
- Non-functional digital X-Ray machine, hospital unable to afford repairs costing \$2,559 (in 2019).



Access to Water



Administration

Budget Performance: Revenue

- Central Government transfers: 100% of budget received
- Tax revenue: 55.4% collected
- Non-tax revenue: 32.2%
- Transfers from other government entities: 22.14%
- Grants (incl. donor funds): 86.6%

Staffing Gap: The District has an approved staff structure of 1,193 posts, however out of approved staff structure of 1,193, only 922 (77.3%) posts were filled leaving 271 (22.7%) posts vacant. (AG, 2018)

- District does not maintain a wetlands register.

- Lack of Legal Title for Nabikka forest reserves and wetlands
- No District Environment Committee
