Western part of Uganda with its headquarters 389.1km from Kampala by road.

Unemployment

3,838 youths aged 18-30 years who were neither working nor in school by 2014

Youth Livelihood Programme (YLP)

Low recovery of YLP funds: for groups funded in the financial years 2014/2015, 2015/16 to 2017/18, out of Shs.694, 380,000 disbursed to the groups and due for recovery, Shs111,371,000 had been recovered leaving Shs. 612,159,450

Education (UBOS Census Report of 2014)

- Number of persons aged 6-15 years not attending school: 6,315
- Persons aged 15 years and above whose highest level of education is below S.4 was 62,669 (86.7%)
- 38,238 persons aged 18 years and above who are illiterate

UPE Capitation Grants

Based on the total reported enrolment of 49,754 pupils in the 107 primary schools the District should have received Shs.641, 990,000. However, only Shs.545, 002,639 was disbursed leading to a shortfall in funding of Shs. 96,987,361. ~ Auditor General 2019.

Kisubba Seed Secondary School

- Work behind schedule but ongoing.

Health (UBOS Census Report of 2014)

- 18.7% of households were found to be 5 km or more to the nearest health facility
- Only 39.0 % households had access to piped water
- 730 households were without any toilet facility
- 44,366 (99.1%) households were not living in decent dwellings.

Upgrade Bupomboli Health Centre II and Burondo Health Center II to HC III status (2019)

Audit inspection: Incomplete works (placenta pit, waste pit and pit latrine). There was no request for extension of the contract

Bundibugyo Hospital, IV (Auditor General 2018)

“available medical equipment is insufficient in number, need replacement as they have become old and others are not in existence”, Auditor General 2018

Nyahuka Health Centre IV and Kikyoo Health Centre

“the ophthalmic departments do not function due to lack of medical equipment and their laboratories were not fully functional due to inadequate medical equipment. In the absence of basic medical equipment’s and non-functional departments in the health Centres, health service delivery cannot be fully administered to the community.” Auditor General, 2018

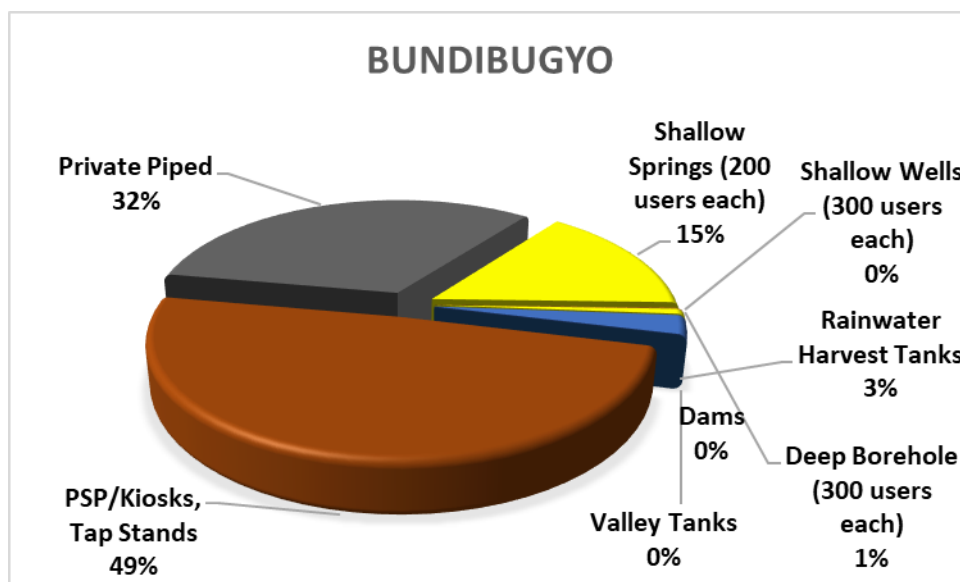

Tadooba: 56.6% Paraffin Lantern: 12.7% Electricity: 11.1%

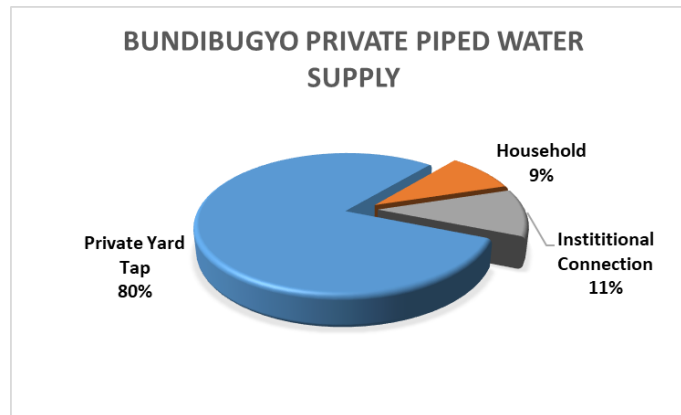

Administration

Budget Performance: Revenue
