On inspection the site was found abandoned owing to the high water table. The District had no money to redesign the school (update for 2020 required).



Health (UBOS Census Report of 2014)

- 15% households were found to be 5 Km or more away from the nearest health facility
- Less than half of the households (43.5%) households havet access to piped water
- 1,010 households were without any toilet facility

- 106,363 (94.3%) households were not living in decent dwellings.

Shortfalls of donor funds affected the health related support like Early Childhood Development (ECD)

Mbarara Regional Referral Hospital (AG 2018)

- Understaffing: 19% of the positions in the hospital are vacant. (Out of the 377 approved staff positions, only 304 positions (81%) were filled leaving 73 positions)
- Equipment is obsolete, faulty and not in fair condition. Patients are referred to other facilities to receive the same services hence putting their lives at risk.
- Other equipment has not been supplied.
- **Debt** (domestic arrears) the hospital owes suppliers Shs. 1,925,001,338.

Construction of a maternity ward at Rubaya Health Centre III (Auditor General 2018)

Materials exceeded market price by 76.8%


Access to Energy: More people use paraffin lamps for domestic lighting than electricity.

Audit Report On the District Programmes

Budget Performance (Audit 2018)

Wasteful (nugatory) Expenditure: the district paid out Shs. 40,000,000 as part payment of Shs. 247,000,000 in respect of legal costs awarded to an employee. The costs could have been avoided if management had acted in a manner that does not contravene the law.

Shortfall: Central Govt. sent only 85.7% of the funds budgeted for leading to a shortfall of 14.3%. Central govt. sent only Shs. 30,557,040,702 (85.7%) out of Shs. 35,654,806,629 budgeted, leading to a shortfall of Shs. 5,097,765,927.

Unemployment

Youth Livelihood Programme (YLP): The audit focused on an amount of Shs. 309,838,832 disbursed to the District Local Government in the Financial Year 2014/2015 whose recovery period of three years had expired by 30th June 2018

- The District received a total amount of Shs. 309,838,832 for the financial year 2014/2015.
- The groups funded in 2014/2015 were expected to have repaid a total amount of Shs. 309,838,832 by close of the financial year 2017/2018, only Shs. 131,526,500 (42%) was recovered leaving a balance of Shs. 178,312,332 (58%)
- This means there is less available for on-lending to new groups.
