- 38.2 % households were found to be 5 km or more to the nearest health facility
- Only 7.1% households had access to piped water
- 1,239 households were without any toilet facility
- 24,801 (99.6%) households were not living in decent dwellings.



- The absence of a register of user licences means use of the natural resources is/was \_ unregulated and therefor they are in danger of depletion. Because wetlands and forests create household income, their depletion will increase poverty.
