2,890 youths aged 18-30 years who were neither working nor in school by 2014

Youth Livelihood Programme (YLP) (from the Auditor General's Report 2019)

Low recovery of YLP funds: the groups which were funded in 2016/2017 FY were expected to have repaid a total amount of Shs. 171,300,000 (Interest exclusive) by close of the financial year 2018/2019, only Shs. 8,795,000 (5%) was repaid.

- Some sampled groups were found not to exist.

Women Enterprise Programme

Education (UBOS Census Report of 2014)

- Number of persons aged 6-15 years not attending school is 3,429
- Persons aged 15 years and above whose highest level of education is below S.4 was 43,709 (84.0%)
- 17,938 persons aged 18 years and above who are illiterate

Construction of Katoma Seed Secondary school in Kibiga Sub-county

- Delayed completion

Health (UBOS Census Report of 2014)

- 23.7% households were found to be 5 Km or more to the nearest health facility
- Only 12.8% households had access to piped water
- 1,130 households were without any toilet facility
- 33,158 (97.5%) households were not living in decent dwellings.

- Incomplete work
- Partial roofing
- Roof beams exposed to sunshine and rain
- Placenta pit and latrines not dug

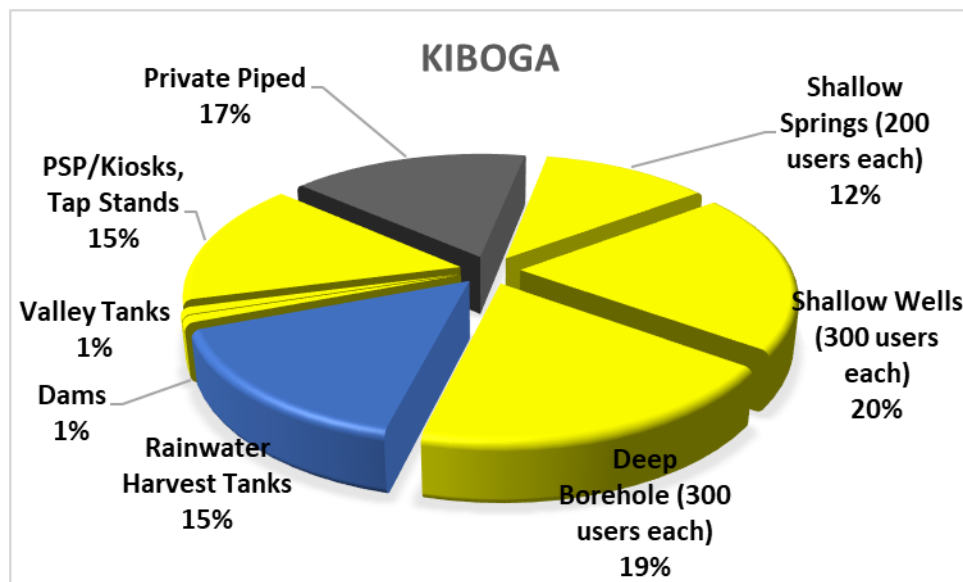
Distribution of Source of Energy Per Household for Lighting (UBOS Census 2014)

Tadooba: 54.5% Paraffin Lantern: 11% Electricity: 16%

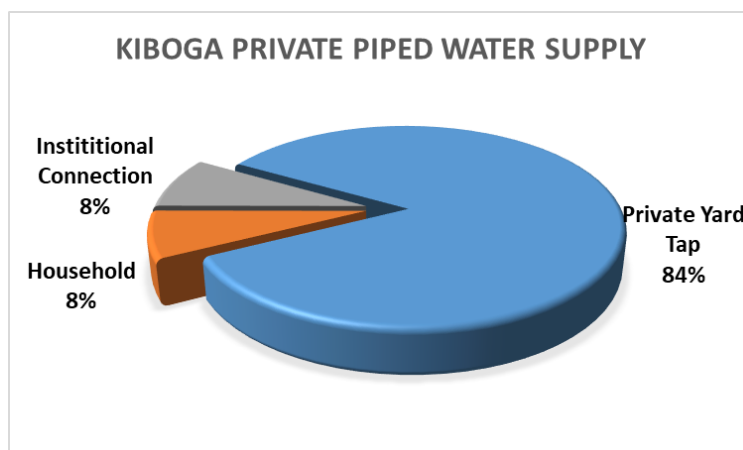
Access to Water

Road Maintenance (Uganda Road Fund) (from Auditor General's Report 2019)

Kambugu –Kalusungwa (8Km) Road



- No headwalls on cross culverts in Kinoga Swamp bordering Dabiriza and Degeya villages.

Kiryamuddo –Kasejjere –Kambugu (16.5Km)



- Overgrown bush on at Sinzibwa Village blocks visibility of the road users in the corners.
- Unprotected metal cross culvert at Kanurira swamp at the border of Sinzibwa and Kyeyagalire Villages

Mpangala –Biko –Bulaga –Kafunda (15Km)



- Water gullies newly developing in the middle of the road due to the absence of routine gangs.
- Road quickly deteriorating, due to the existence of potholes and cross drains along shoulders in some sections.
