Youth Livelihood Programme (YLP) (from Auditor General's Report 2019)

One of the two groups sampled was trading well until the Uganda-Rwanda border was closed.

Low recovery of YLP funds: whereas eighty-one (81) groups were expected to have repaid a total of UGX. 358,498,400 (interest inclusive) by the end of 2018/2019.

Women Enterprise Programme: out of thirty groups that were expected to have repaid a total amount of UGX. 98,995,501(interest inclusive) by the end of the financial year 2018/2019, UGX. 71,466,500(72%) had been repaid.

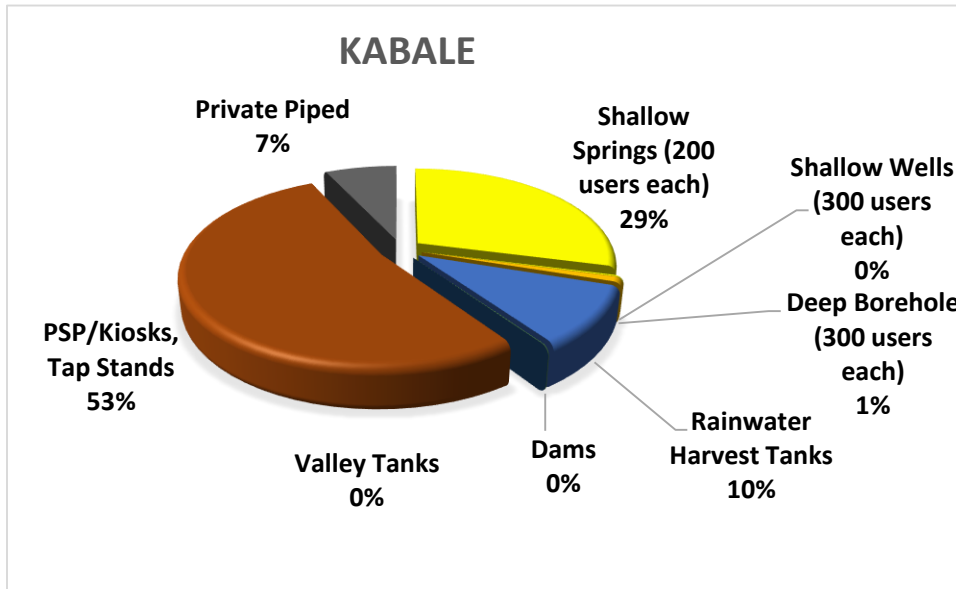

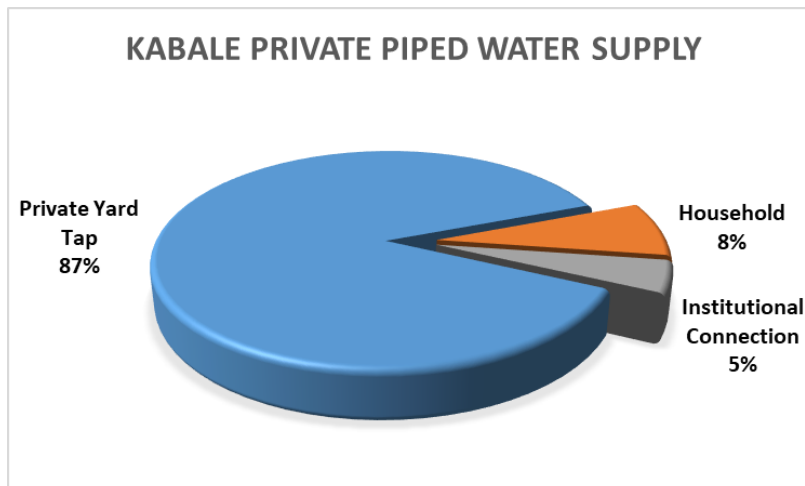
Distribution of Source of Energy Per Household for Lighting (UBOS Census 2014)

- Land degradation in Buramba – Mugandu watershed caused by: over-cultivation; heavy rains, over grazing; lack of vegetation cover in some places; poor cultivation methods; short fallow periods/no fallow; hence land is ‘exhausted’, bush burning.
