Youth Livelihood Programme (YLP)

Low recovery of YLP funds: from the financial year 2013/2014 to 30th June 2019, the district had recovered SHS. 84,364,385 (19.1%) out of the expected total amount due of SHS. 440,551,980.

Women Enterprise Programme: from the financial year 2016/2017 to 30th June 2019, the district had recovered only SHS. 18,964,024 (26.6%) out of the expected total amount due.

Education

- Number of persons aged 6-15 years not attending school: 2,100
- Persons aged 15 years and above whose highest level of education is below S.4 was 32,644 (89.5 %)
- 15,793 persons aged 18 years and above who are illiterate

Health (UBOS Census Report of 2014)

- 32.1% households were found to be 5 Km or more to the nearest health facility
- Only 1.0 % households had access to piped water
- 2,653 households were without any toilet facility
- 25,067 (99.8%) households were not living in decent dwellings.

Buvuma Islands: 52 Islands, 38 parishes and 212 villages.

There are only12 health facilities located on 8 Islands giving coverage of 15.4%. only 8 parishes out of 38 have Health Centre IIs representing 20%

 Only four (4) sub-counties out of 9 sub-counties have Health Centre IIIs representing giving 44.4% coverage.


